Ce programme sans frais est parrainé par Emploi Ontario et offert aux francophones de 19 ans et plus qui désirent améliorer leurs compétences, obtenir une équivalence scolaire de 12e année en suivant le programme Accès carrières études, se préparer pour un programme d'apprentissage ou d'études postsecondaires, obtenir leur indépendance ou un emploi. Les participantes et participants ont accès aux services d'appui du collège et peuvent également suivre un cours collégial sans frais. Le programme est offert à longueur d'année, soit traditionnellement ou à progression autocontrôlée, en salle de classe, en milieu d'apprentissage mixte ou en ligne. Des services de formation linguistique sont également offerts. Certains participants et participantes pourraient être admissibles à recevoir de l'aide financière pour couvrir les frais de transport ou de garde d'enfant.

This free program sponsored by Employment Ontario is available for Francophones 19 years and older who wish to upgrade their skills, earn a grade 12 equivalency certificate through the ACE program, prepare for an apprenticeship or post-secondary education, or gain independence or employment. Students have access to college support services and can also take a college course without paying tuition fees. Courses run year-round in both traditional and self-paced settings via face-to-face, blended, and online learning. We also offer language training services using state-of-the-art language laboratories fully equipped to provide an interactive experience to students wishing to improve their French or English skills. Financial assistance may be available for those who qualify to help cover transportation and childcare costs.

The Literacy and Basic Skills (LBS) program allows adult learners to refresh and upgrade their skills in mathematics, communication and computer skills at an introductory level. Learners can improve their readiness for employment and prepare for other training opportunities. Many LBS learners proceed directly into the Academic and Career Entrance (ACE) program.

The ACE program provides adult learners with the opportunity to upgrade their academic skills with a particular focus on preparation for college programs and apprenticeship training. Depending on the learner's goal, studies may include mathematics, communication, biology, and chemistry. Successful completion of the ACE program provides a grade 12 equivalence that is recognized for admission to college programs and apprenticeship training in Ontario.

The Academic Upgrading program is tuition-free to residents of Ontario who are at least 19 years of age. Financial support for childcare and transportation is available to qualified applicants.
